## Joan Liska, Kelsey Street

Ms. Liska expressed her concerns about the scarcity of fire hydrants in and around her residence and spoke of the devastating affects it has had in the past. She advised the commission that she would like to donate an inversion table to the fire department.

Mr. Penney inquired about certain expenditures listed in the Monthly Expense Detail Report and asked if the larger expenditures were voted on and approved by the board. He urged the By-Laws Revision Committee to thoroughly review the charter prior to recommending changes to the by-laws. Mr. Penney reminded the commission that election records are to be secure. He also suggested a per diem, interim back-up staff member when administrative staff if not available.

The chief reported that 3,000 pounds of food and monetary donations were donated to Amazing Grace Food Pantry by Local 3918 as a result of their food drive at Big Y. Annual apparatus maintenance has been completed. South Fire will be hosting this year's city-wide fire prevention poster contest awards ceremony. Chief Trzaski reminded the commission about the Employee and Citizen Awards Ceremony being held in January.

Commissioner Thazhampallath gave a brief update about the renovation project. Significant progress is being made. It is anticipated that the project will be completed in April/May 2005.

We wish to thank you and Chief James Trzaski for your cooperation during our recent Public Protection Classification (PPC) survey. ISO has completed its analysis of the structural fire suppression delivery system provided in your community. The resulting classification is indicated above.

If you would like to know more about your community's PPC classification, or if you would like to learn about the potential effect of proposed changes to your fire suppression delivery system, please call us at the phone number listed below.

ISO's Public Protection Classification Program (PPC) plays an important role in the underwriting process at insurance companies. In fact, most U.S. insurers – including the largest ones – use PPC information as part of their decision- making when deciding what business to write, coverage's to offer or prices to charge for personal or commercial property insurance.

Each insurance company independently determines the premiums it charges its policyholders. The way an insurer uses ISO's information on public fire protection may depend on several things – the company's fire-loss experience, ratemaking methodology, underwriting guidelines, and its marketing strategy.

Through ongoing research and loss experience analysis, we identified additional differentiation in fire loss experience within our PPC program, which resulted in the revised classifications. We based the differing fire loss experience on the fire suppression capabilities of each community. The new classifications will improve the predictive value for insurers while benefiting both commercial and residential property owners. We've published the new classifications as "X" and "Y" — formerly the "9" and "8B" portion of the split classification, respectively. For example:

- A community currently graded as a split 6/9 classification will now be a split 6/6X classification; with the "6X" denoting what was formerly classified as "9."
- Similarly, a community currently graded as a split 6/8B classification will now be a split 6/6Y classification, the "6Y" denoting what was formerly classified as "8B."

- Communities graded with single "9" or "8B" classifications will remain intact.
- Properties over 5 road miles from a recognized fire station would receive a class 10.

PPC is important to communities and fire departments as well. Communities whose PPC improves may get lower insurance prices. PPC also provides fire departments with a valuable benchmark, and is used by many departments as a valuable tool when planning, budgeting and justifying fire protection improvements.

ISO appreciates the high level of cooperation extended by local officials during the entire PPC survey process. The community protection baseline information gathered by ISO is an essential foundation upon which determination of the relative level of fire protection is made using the Fire Suppression Rating Schedule.

The classification is a direct result of the information gathered, and is dependent on the resource levels devoted to fire protection in existence at the time of survey. Material changes in those resources that occur after the survey is completed may affect the classification. Although ISO maintains a pro-active process to keep baseline information as current as possible, in the event of changes please call us at 1-800-444-4554, option 2 to expedite the update activity.

ISO is the leading supplier of data and analytics for the property/casualty insurance industry. Most insurers use PPC classifications for underwriting and calculating premiums for residential, commercial and industrial properties. The PPC program is not intended to analyze all aspects of a comprehensive structural fire suppression delivery system program. It is not for purposes of determining compliance with any state or local law, nor is it for making loss prevention or life safety recommendations.

## **Public Safety Telecommunications Report** February 2025

- 1. Monthly Call Statistics sheet is available. Activity for January is approximately 6,450 incidents. Total 911 calls are 1,986 and 6,813 administrative calls.
- 2. Staffing update: currently at 18 Dispatchers as of February 10<sup>th</sup>. Training is no longer continuing for two new dispatchers. We remain in the process of starting a new hire for certified dispatchers.
- 3. The Public Safety 911 Center Building Committee has a tentative meeting on February 27, 2025. This will be the first meeting of that Committee. All members have been sworn in.
- 4. In conjunction with the three fire districts we had proposed changes to the radio dispatch methods and use of resources to provide the safest on scene communication methods. We agreed that a trial period would determine the feasibility of the system.

The FD's did have issues with the change and we are making changes to meet their needs.
